Announcements:

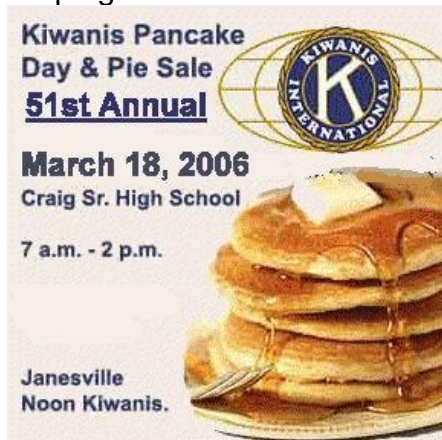
Pastor Judi announced that Irene Stewart's sister Nina is terminally ill.
