On August 29th, Katrina hit the Gulf Coast. On Sept. 2nd, FEMA asked for 3,000 - 2 person teams of firemen and other relief workers to assist with relief. They were deployed, got briefings, received government credit cards, vaccinations. They then broke into 8 man "strike teams".

The local men went to Mississippi on Sept. 10th. Their assignment was community relations. They were to assess the needs of the people - such basics as water, food and shelter. One of the problems was Lack of refrigeration due to a total, area wide outage of electricity.
