Our Program:



Carleen Courtney began by commenting on our "spirited" meetings (If you haven't been to a meeting in a while, you are missing out!!) Then she shared with us the best kept secret in Janesville HealthNet. HealthNet was established in 1994.

It is a free clinic for those who can not afford medical care. They provide care for people age 18 through 64. Kids are usually covered by Badger care, so they do not see too many kids. They see a variety of medical conditions and dental issues. They even have specialists to whom they can refer patients.

In 2005, HealthNet treated 675 people through 4000 visits. They work through big drug companies to get medicines for the patients at no cost. They anticipate \$1,000,000 in medicines will be prescribed in 2006. These patients would not be able to take these medications, if not for HealthNet, due to the costs.

They are located on the second floor of the Dubes Jewelry building. So if you know of someone in need, don't forget that we have a free clinic in Janesville. HealthNet is supported largely by donations, of money and time. Carleen thanked all the people she recognized in our audience who have helped in the past.
