He recommended that anyone interested in attending a future international conference attend one. The next one is scheduled for Orlando, Florida in 2008. The club pays the registration and contributes to our member's expenses to attend.

Dr. Kevin reported on his experiences as he attended a sectional on photography for club events, publications and marketing. Another sectional on growing your club proved interesting because many in attendance were focusing on trivial issues rather than the big picture.
