Our speaker today was Dave Flood. Dave is the founder and Operator of 'Non-Toxic Youth Alternatives, Inc'.



The program is designed for teens who are lost and need adults to help them find their way through these tumultuous years.

Dave lost a brother at age 22 and decided that he could make a difference in people's lives by saving other teens who need some direction. Dave became familiar with Kiwanis because he works with Don Chapin's son, Curt who is a volunteer at the Center.

Non-Toxic currently has an indoor facility at 512 N Main St in Edgerton. This Teen Center has four pool Tables and a licensed restaurant as well as other games available. They also have a 16 acre outdoor camp.

The teen center was opened 15 years ago and has been expanded 3 times. The camp is a more recent addition. The Program currently has 5 volunteers and serves approximately 70 teens. The staff are all volunteers and the program is funded completely by donations.
