We inducted David Whittman today. David is a former Kiwanis member, and he is employed by Charter Media/Charter Communications. He and his wife and 2 school age children moved here from St. Louis two years ago. Make a mental note to introduce yourself to David at our next meeting.

### Program:

Larry Markow talked about Operation Lifesaver, which is a safety program that all the major U.S. railroads are publicizing. Larry is a conductor for the Union Pacific Railroad Co., and he is presently assigned to their Milwaukee District.



This safety program is intended to make drivers aware of the danger and reduce the number of people killed each year by trains. The program uses the words, Stop, Look, and Listen, to help people remember before crossing or walking along rail tracks.

In emergency situations, cars can stop in 200' at 55 mph, semis at 300', but a train takes 5,280' to stop, so train engineers are simply unable to stop in a short distance if a car or truck gets stuck or is blocked when crossing tracks. In rural areas where there are no flashing red lights or crossing arms that come down, the railroad crossing sign means drivers must stop, by law, before driving ahead.
