Former Janesville council member Harry O'Leary presented the program, speaking on behalf of Keep Janesville. The name stands for Keep Economy Efficiency and Professionalism in Janesville. The organization was formed as a political action committee by concerned Janesville citizens who wish to retain the present Council/Manager form of government and oppose the two pending referenda that would change the existing Council/Manager form of government.

The four purposes of KEEP Janesville are:
1. Educate the public on the alternative forms of government and show the overwhelming advantages of the

Council/Manager form.

2. Show the public that citizens have the right to attempt to create change by communicating with Council members or by attempting to elect new Council members, and that changing the form of government will not assure a more responsive government.

3. Show the public the City Manager is hired by, directed by, and is subject to discharge by the City Council.

4. Show the public that the Council/Manager form of government has provided great benefits to the City over the years, including excellent City services, low taxes and clean, efficient government.

Voting will occur during the spring



election on April 6, 2004. Since this is over spring break, some may be away on family vacations. There is a link on the KEEP web site to an absentee ballot application.
