WI Dairy Producers

Doug and Kristine Rebout, representing the Wisconsin Dairy Producers, were the program today. Their family operates a farm west of Janesville with Doug's parents and brothers. They currently milk about 200 head of cows and farm 4300 acres. There are about 17300 farms in Wisconsin that milk about 1.3 million cows.

For every \$1 a dairy farmer produces, there is a 7 time turn of that dollar in their local community.

In Wisconsin, the dairy farmers contribute about 18 billion dollars annually to the state's economy. So it is no wonder that the state of Wisconsin is among the top 5 cheese producing areas in the world.
